

ARTICULATION AGREEMENT
between
South University and Palm Beach State College

I. PURPOSE

The purpose of this articulation agreement (the Agreement) is to establish procedures and guidelines for students to transfer to South University (SU) degree program following completion of a certificate, diploma, or associate's degree program at Palm Beach State College, in Lake Worth, FL. With respect to courses of study that lead to an associate's degree both SU and Palm Beach State College will facilitate the transfer of associate-degree graduates to baccalaureate completion programs at SU. This advanced start baccalaureate program (also known as a "2+2 option") is designed to maximize a students' transfer credit award.

II. ELEMENTS OF THE AGREEMENT

A. Admission to South University

1. Palm Beach State College's eligible graduates will be reviewed as pre-qualified applicants for South University degree programs. Applicants will be required to complete all South University admission's requirements in effect at the time of application. South University admissions requirements are detailed in its most recent catalog.
2. To be eligible for application to an advanced start bachelor's program, a student must be an associate-degree graduate or must submit a letter from the Palm Beach State College's Registrar indicating that the student is in good standing, the expected date of graduation, the associate's degree expected to be earned, and the program/major. Upon graduation, the student must submit proof of having been awarded an associate's degree.
3. Upon acceptance and signing of the South University enrollment agreement, transfer students will be subject to all South University policies, codes of conduct, college procedures, and requirements. These are described in the most recent South University catalog.

B. Credit Transferability

1. Palm Beach State graduates having completed degree programs will be eligible for a course-by-course review for transfer of credits to South University. Palm Beach State graduates having completed an associate's degree program (AA, AAS, or AS) consisting of a minimum of 60 semester credits (or the equivalent) will be eligible for a block transfer of up to 90-quarter credits and acceptance into SU's "advanced start" baccalaureate option.
2. South University will complete a course-by-course review of all transfer credits submitted on official transcripts from Palm Beach State College. A Prior Learning Assessment Curriculum Evaluation (PLACE) may be developed to aid in the transfer credit evaluation process. South University reserves the right to make a final determination on all matters related to transferability and course equivalencies.
3. Palm Beach State College graduates who are unable to fulfill South University prerequisites at Palm Beach State College must complete them at South University. Prerequisites are listed in its current catalog and vary based on the bachelor's degree program and emphasis chosen.

4. Palm Beach State College graduates must fulfill South University requirements, which entail completion of no less than 40-percent of their program requirements at SU, including a minimum of 50-percent of the major requirements, including the capstone course, at SU. Credit earned through any combination of Transfer Credit, Challenge Credit or Experiential Credit will not exceed 60-percent of total credits required for graduation.

C. Coordination

1. South University (SU) and Palm Beach State College (Palm Beach State) agree to:
 - a. Coordinate their efforts to facilitate a collegial and mutually beneficial relationship;
 - b. Provide accurate and timely information about the articulation agreement to prospective SU students, who are either recent or soon-to-be Palm Beach State College graduates, ~~graduates~~, and;
 - c. Designate academic alliance coordinators as primary contact persons for the respective institutions to facilitate coordination of this agreement.
2. South University agrees to:
 - a. Provide Palm Beach State College relevant transfer information and current South University brochures and/or catalogs;
 - b. Communicate with Palm Beach State College students soon-to-be graduates, and graduates via e-mail, postal mail, telephone, and other means to offer them the opportunity of enrolling in a bachelor's completion program at South University. South University's Senior Director of Admissions will obtain this list of PBSC "soon-to-be" graduates after paying the appropriate fee for such information to PBSC.
 - c. Participate in Palm Beach State College education fairs when offered by College and if available;
 - d. Encourage Palm Beach State College students who are attending classes at Palm Beach State College to enroll at South University after graduating from their current program;
 - e. Provide Palm Beach State College with a toll-free telephone number (866-629-2902) so that Palm Beach State College graduates can discuss their educational goals with a SU advisor, and;
3. Palm Beach State College agrees to:
 - a. Assist South University by communicating the benefits of this articulation agreement to Palm Beach State College students, and graduates;
 - b. Up to four times per year, allow South University representatives will make arrangements with the PBSC deans of students to conduct on-campus presentations and marketing regarding South University programs for Palm Beach State College students, and graduates,
 - c. Make a summary available to students, graduates, staff, and faculty about the agreement to which South University and Palm Beach State College mutually agree, and;
 - d. Cooperate with SU to establish data transfer of curriculum and of student records, when applicable, and with student permission in accordance with all applicable laws and regulations.

III. Terms

- A. This Agreement is effective for the South University academic term beginning with the date of the fully executed document, and shall continue until terminated. Both parties must approve amendments to the Agreement in writing.
- B. Either party may terminate the Agreement upon 90 days written notice to the other party. Notwithstanding the foregoing, either party may terminate the Agreement immediately in the event that participation under the Agreement may give rise to a violation of any requirement of federal or state law or regulation or the requirements of any accrediting agency having jurisdiction. Admission

criteria and academic and other requirements will be subject to the South University Catalog at the time of the students' admission to SU. Active students at the time of termination will be grandfathered into their selected program.

- C. The Agreement may be executed by either electronic or facsimile transmission in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original.


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

SOUTH UNIVERSITY TRANSFER OF CREDIT POLICY

Transfer Policies
Transfer of credit will be given if the courses were taken at an accredited collegiate institution, the course was equivalent to courses offered at South University or compatible with South University's distribution requirements, and the course carries a grade of C or better.
However, coursework will be evaluated for its current relevance and may not transfer if the material in the coursework is outdated. University credit will not be given for developmental courses such as basic Mathematics/Algebra or English.
Credits earned at an accredited technical college may not transfer unless the credit earned is equivalent to courses offered in degree programs including the associate's degree.
Acceptance of Credits
Acceptance of credits earned at other institutions and/or through examination is limited to 60% of the total hours required for an undergraduate degree. No more than half the major area course requirements can be earned through transfer and/or exemption credit.
The university reserves the right to reject any or all credits from other institutions, regardless of their accreditation status, when it determines through investigation or otherwise that the quality of instruction at such institutions is for any reason deficient or unsatisfactory. The judgment of the university on this question shall be final.
The university reserves the right to disallow transfer credit for courses if the student's subsequent grades in required courses in the same subject fall below average.
