Articulation Agreement with
SOUTH UNIVERSITY – RICHMOND**

This agreement with Bridging Communities Regional Career and Technical Center will be in effect for the 2020/21 and 2021/2022 school years.

South University – Bridging Communities Regional Career and Technical Center agree that students successfully completing the following courses at the Bridging Communities Regional Career and Technical Center will receive credit at South University – Richmond:

Note: South University operates on a quarter system and credit hours reflect that system.

Courses listed above for the Bridging Communities Regional Career and Technical Center originate from Rappahannock Community College and are taught at Bridging Communities Regional Career and Technical Center for purposes of providing dual enrollment credit to students. In addition, because students will transfer in to South University greater than 24 quarter credit hours and with a minimum 2.0 CGPA they will be exempted from UVC1000 College Study Skills. Students will take another course offered by South University to fulfill the 4 credit hour degree requirement.

To receive credit at South University - Richmond, Bridging Communities Regional Career and Technical Center students must:

1. Apply and be admitted to South University - Richmond
2. Earn a minimum grade of “C” (70%) in the Bridging Communities Regional Career and Technical Center course listed in the table above
3. Submit an official Bridging Communities Regional Career and Technical Center academic transcript documenting successful graduation
4. Enroll in courses at South University - Richmond

Both South University – Richmond and the Bridging Communities Regional Career and Technical Center agree to communicate any curriculum changes which may affect the agreed upon relationships between articulated courses at the respective schools.
