

**Articulation Agreement
Between
South University and Bryant & Stratton College
August 1, 2018**

I. Purpose

The purpose of this articulation agreement (the Agreement) is to establish procedures and guidelines for students who complete the Associate of Applied Science in Criminal Justice Studies to enroll in the Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice program following the completion of an associate's degree from any accepted accredited university.

II. Elements of the Agreement

A. Admission to South University

Eligible students will be reviewed as pre-qualified for the South University Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice program. Applicants will be required to complete all South University admissions requirements in effect at the time of application. Requirements for admission to the Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice program can be found in the latest version of the South University catalog.

B. Credit Transferability

1. Associate's graduates who have completed the Associate of Applied Science in Criminal Justice Studies at Bryant & Stratton College will be accepted as transfer students at South University (see Attachment).

2. The final results of a transfer review are contingent upon receipt of official transcripts. South University reserves the right to make a final determination on all matters related to transferability and course equivalencies.

C. Coordination

1. South University and Bryant & Stratton College agree to:

a. Coordinate their efforts to facilitate a collegial and mutually beneficial relationship;

b. Provide accurate and timely information about the articulation agreement to prospective South University students, including current students at Bryant & Stratton College as well as graduates, and;

c. Designate an academic alliance coordinator as the primary contact person for the respective institutions to facilitate coordination of this agreement.

2. South University agrees to:

a. Provide Bryant & Stratton College with all relevant application and transfer of credit information and current South University catalogs and Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice program brochures;

b. Encourage Bryant & Stratton College students to enroll at South University after graduating from an associate's program;

c. Provide Bryant and Stratton College with contact information that their current students, soon-to-be graduates and alumni can use to connect with a South University advisor;

d. Provide a tuition scholarship of 20% to graduates of the Associate of Applied Science in Criminal Justice Studies program after they have successfully completed an associate's degree at an accepted accredited institution.

3. Bryant & Stratton College agrees to:

a. Assist South University by communicating the benefits of this articulation agreement to Bryant & Stratton College students and graduates.

III. Terms


A. This agreement is effective for the South University academic term beginning with the date of the fully executed document, and shall continue until terminated. Both parties must approve amendments to the Agreement in writing.

B. Either party may terminate the Agreement upon 90 days written notice to the other party.

C. The foregoing notwithstanding, either party may terminate the Agreement immediately in the event that participation under the Agreement may give rise to a violation of any requirement of federal or state law or regulation or the requirements of any accrediting agency having jurisdiction.

D. Admission criteria and academic and other requirements will be subject to the South University catalog at the time of the student's admission to South University. Active students at the time of termination will be grandfathered into their selected program.

E. The Agreement may be executed by either electronic or facsimile transmission in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original.







Students will be eligible to transfer in 82 quarter credit hours towards the completion of the Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice degree at South University with a completed Bryant and Stratton College Associate of Applied Science in Criminal Justice degree.

The below Bryant & Stratton College courses are not transferrable:

MATH101 Workplace Mathematics (3) - This course is equivalent to South University's MAT0099 Principles of Algebra, which is a developmental course.

ENGL102 Research and Writing for the Workplace (3) – This course is equivalent to South University’s ENG0099 Principles of Composition, which is a developmental course.

To be eligible for consideration, students must complete an associate’s degree. Only coursework with a grade of C or better can be considered. All advanced standing requests must be approved by the Program Director, subject to receipt of official transcripts.
